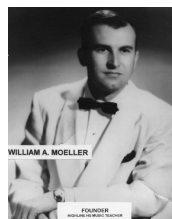

Cost of a move age 12 and under 9 cents. Included; cartoon, Saturday serials, and a main feature. Most Saturday's feature movies, were Western. Coca Cola 5 cents, bag of pop corn 10 cents, jaw breaker 1 cent. The entire day could be enjoyed for 25 cents.

Opened Fall 1947, closed 1962, burned to the ground the winter of 1967. February 2011 - Current location of Burien Bark.

Largest of three quant-sit style theaters built in WA., seating 875, plus an enclosed balcony know as a "cry room" for parents with small baby's. When first entering the lobby, to your right was a large fish pond filled with Rainbow Trout. Three bedroom apartment above the theater. Architect Mrs. Bjarne Moe.
